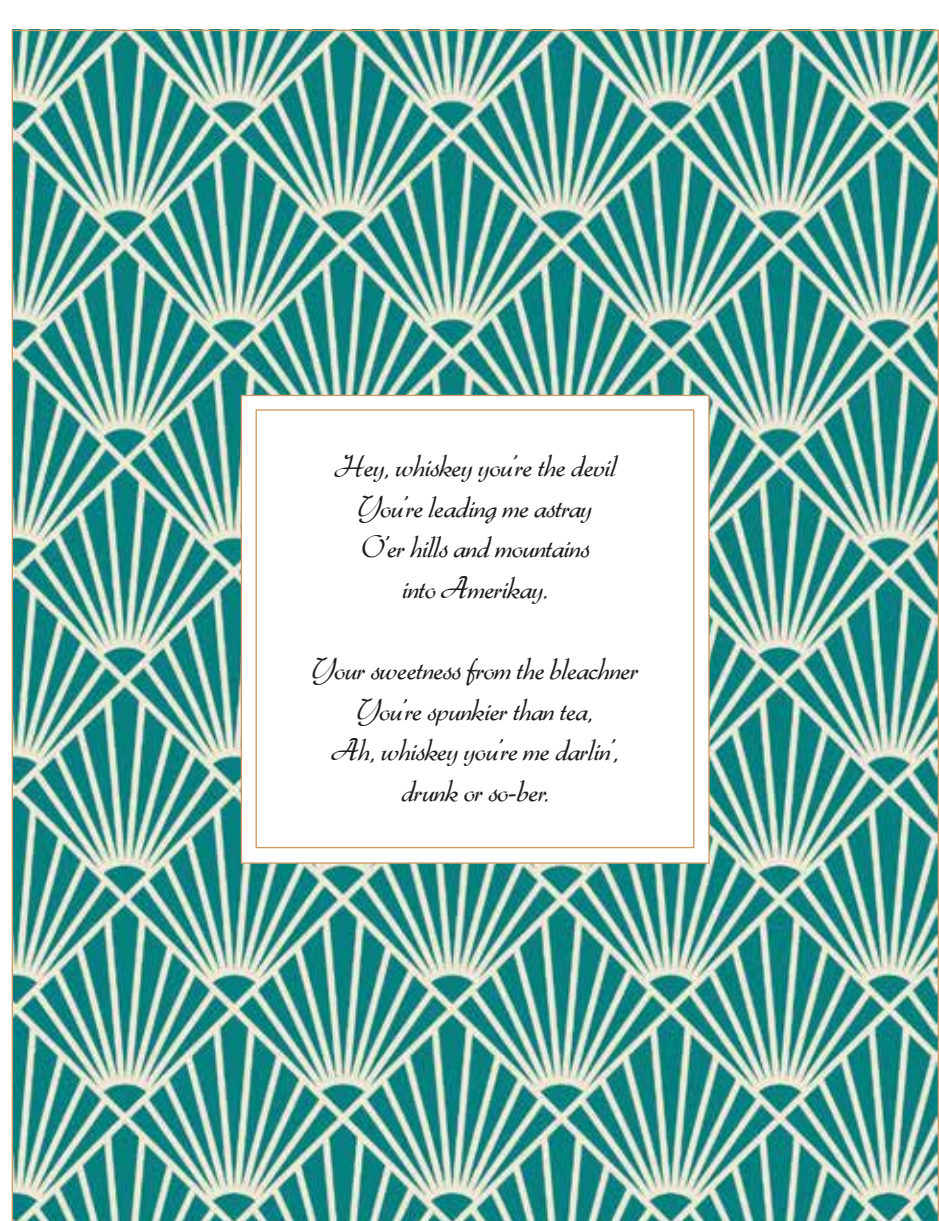


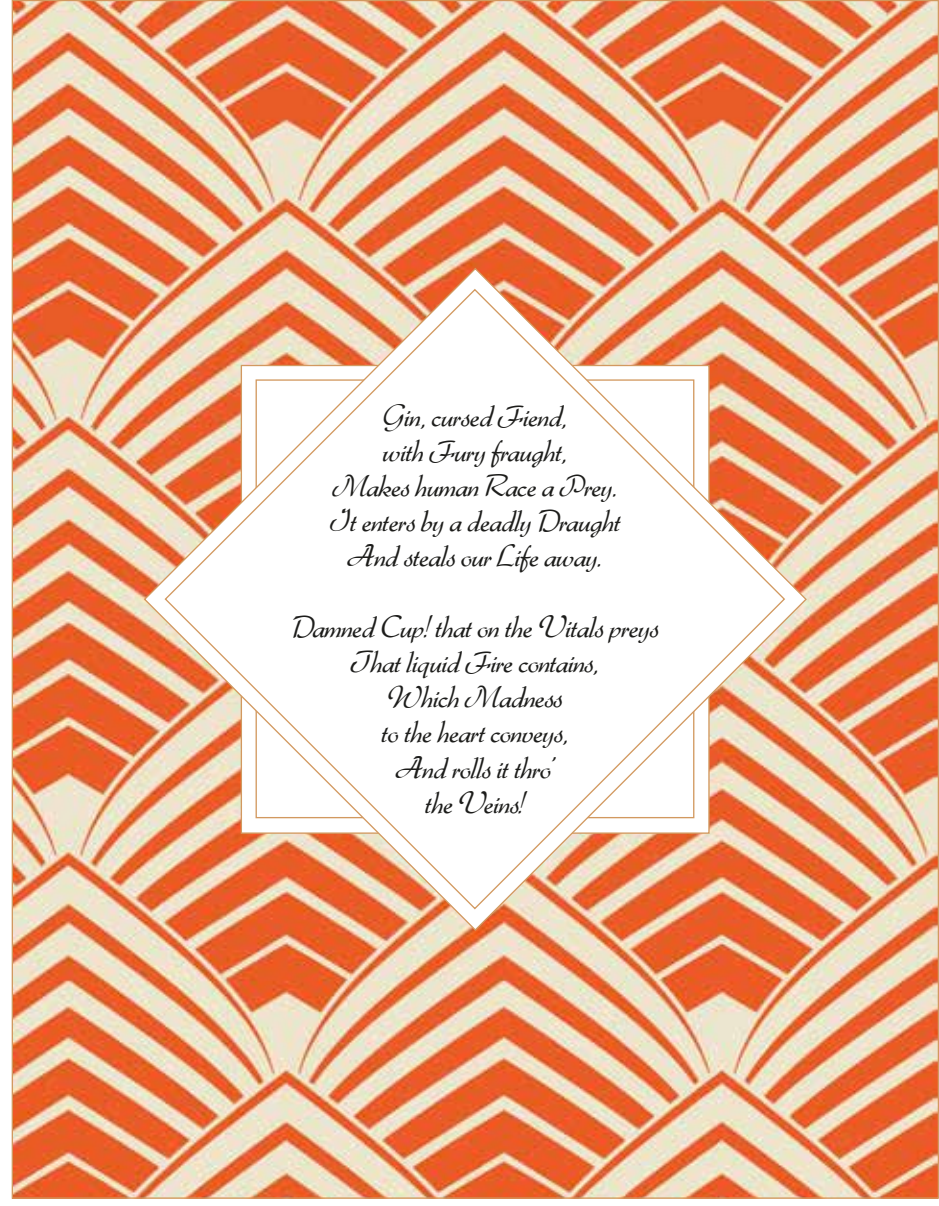
*Its jovially together boys -

From the old king of rum.*



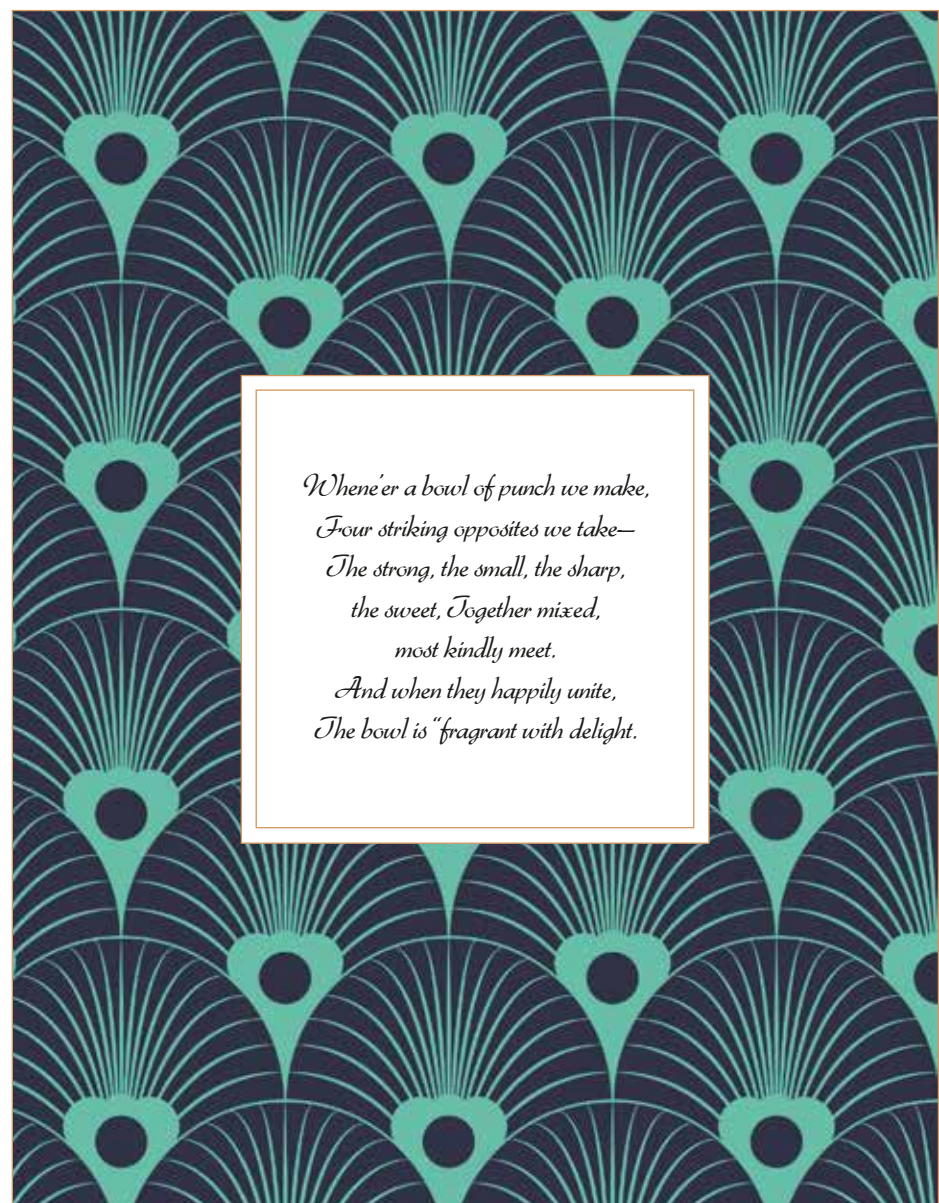
*Hey, whiskey you're the devil

the Veins!*



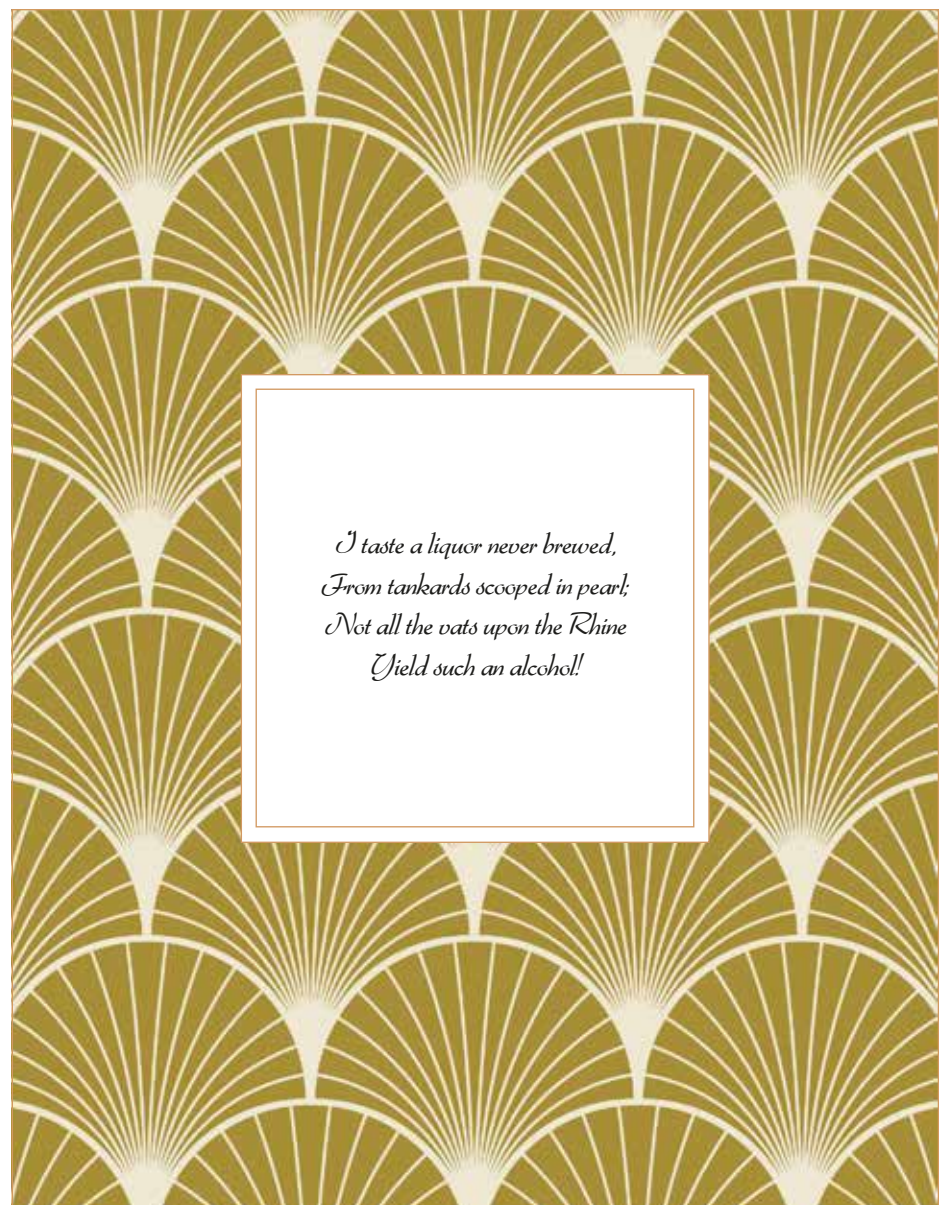
*When'er a bowl of punch we make,

	<i>When the word "highball" appeared in 1898, "ball" being a bartenders' slang for a glass in the 1890s, a "high ball," a tall glass, it simply meant a Scotch and soda...but soon highball meant any kind of whiskey and soda. Now it stands for any array of no nonsense, straight up classics.</i>

The old-fashioned glassware is now synonymous with this classic, but is also a fine suitor to any zesty and clean palate cocktail.</i>
